But, some of our classrooms are enjoying watching *The Karate Kid* to learn about Growth Mindset versus Fixed Mindset. According to Carol Deweck, growth mindset is the belief that anyone can be good at anything, because your abilities are entirely due to your actions. Contrarily, fixed mindset is the belief that you either are or aren’t good at something, based on your inherent nature, because it’s just who you are. Through *The Karate Kid*, our students are watching as lead character, Dre, begins to develop a growth mindset and learn to be socially successful in a brand new country (China).
