Room 17 is making waves

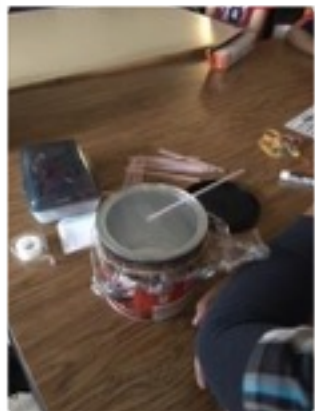
Getting hands on and making learning fun!
