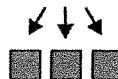
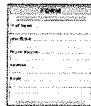
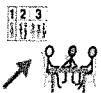
How does the Census Bureau do a census ?



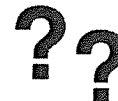
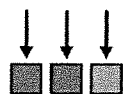
The Census Bureau sends census forms in March.

The questions are about the people living in the home.





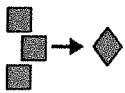

yogurt, any kind



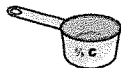
15.25-oz can diced
